

Natural Bitless Bridle™ FITTING & FIRST USE

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<p>Please read this booklet completely for important information to help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Put the Natural Bridle™ on for the first time o Fit the Natural Bridle™ properly on your horse o Start riding! 	<p>As with most pieces of equestrian equipment, the Natural Bitless Bridle works best when it is fitted correctly, and when you and your horse take some time to understand how it works.</p>
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3. Do up the rein strap, leaving lots of room for comfort.
4. Remove the keepers from the Circle-X, if you have not already.
5. The rein strap rings should meet under the chin. Pull them through the Circle-X to shorten or lengthen.
6. The Circle-X should be about 1.5 inches from the noseband.

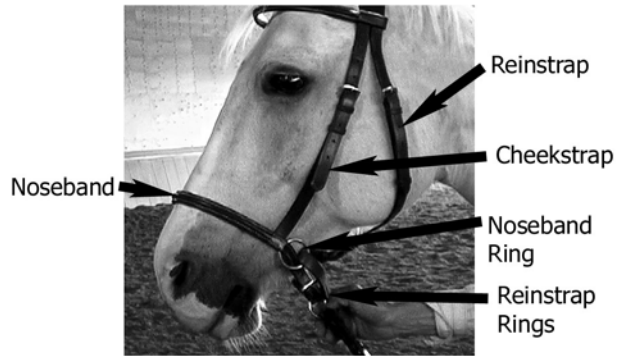


7. The rein strap must cross the fattest part of the horse's cheek
8. Do up the keepers on the Circle-X and you are ready to go!

Leave some comfort room
With loose reins you should be able to slide a finger:

- between the noseband and nose
- between the rein straps and cheeks
- between the Circle-X and jaw

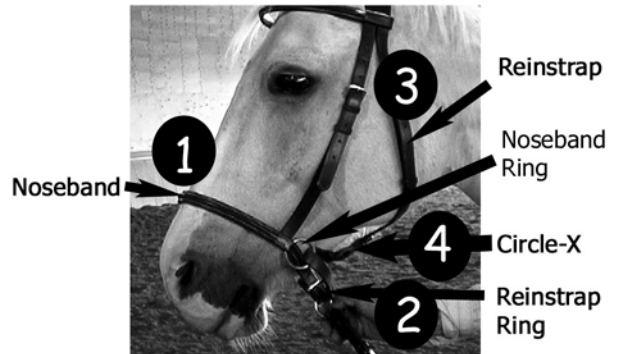
Fitting the Natural Bitless Bridle



1. Undo one side rein strap and slip the bridle on like a halter.
2. Adjust the bridle so the noseband rests on the hard part of the horse's nose.
 - a. Do the noseband up leaving lots of room for comfort
 - b. The noseband usually sits 4 fingers below the cheekbone.
 - c. The noseband is not tight and does not restrict breathing.



Natural Bitless - Quick Check



1. The noseband sits loosely on the hard part of the nose - above the nasal passages.
2. The rein strap rings extend just 2 to 4 inches past the noseband rings (just touch under the jaw).
3. The rein straps cross the fat part of the cheek (not back like a throatlatch). There must be no pressure where they cross under to the Circle-X.
4. The Circle-X is centered under the jaw, with 1.5 to 2 inches between the Circle & the noseband.

Nothing is tight!
Wiggle your fingers between every strap and the horse!
